Preparation: Cut thin poster board or manila paper 2½ x 3½ inches. With damaged and common stamps, make "books" (sets) of 3 or 4 each of types of stamps, etc. My set consists of 3 each of the following:

- A perfin
- Coil plate number copy
- Coil stamps
- Vertical pair, perforated on 4 sides
- Christmas stamps
- Olympics topical
- Slogan Cancellations
- Pre-cancels
- Booklet pane (Could be Booklet stamps or Booklet pair)
- Postage due stamps
- Coil pair
- Coil line pair
- Airmail stamps
- Se-tenant stamps
- Stamps from the transportation coil series
- Space topical
- Commemorative
- Horizontal Pair, perforated on 4 sides
- Imperforate stamps
- A cut square

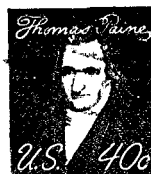
Different categories can be used, according to the ability of your club.

Type or print the clue at the top left of the card. Glue stamps below in an attractive manner. Allow to dry.

To play the game: Shuffle cards. Deal 5 cards to each player. Put remaining cards in center of game table. Starting player asks another player for a category he has in his hand. If player who is asked does not have it, player whose turn it is draws a card from the center pile. If he gets the category

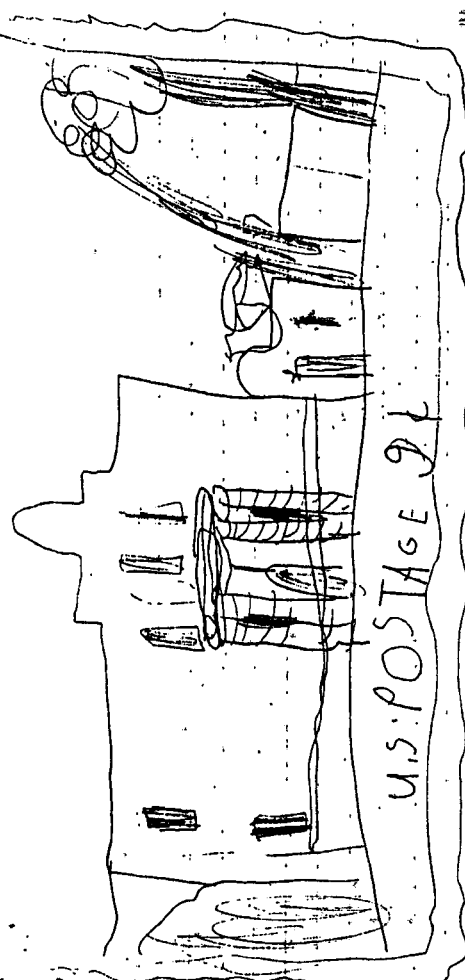

he requested, he takes another turn. If not, play goes to next participant. Each time the requested card is added to player's hand, he continues to play.

When the cards in any player's hand are used up (by his making sets, or by another player's taking them), at his next turn, he draws one from the pile and uses it for his request. When a category is requested, players must give up all cards of that category that they hold in their hands.

Player with the most sets is winner.
