<u>Vice-President for Charitable Programs</u>: This person serves as Chairperson of the Youth Program and assumes other responsibilities as assigned by the Board. This person also serves in place of the President, should the President be absent or unable to serve.

Robert McKenzie, 70 Artist, Engineer

obert McKenzie, an artist and engineer who helped build the New Jersey Turnpike and expand New York's John F. Kennedy Airport, died Dec. 16 from complications of lung cancer at the Mary McCarthy House in East Falmouth. He was 70.

Nicknamed "Papa Skosh" because of his regular use of the word skosh — a small unit of measurement often used by the theater community — Mr. McKenzie was an engineer by day and an artist by night.

After earning a bachelor's degree in engineering from Yale University in 1954, Mr. McKenzie served

for five years in the Navy.

When he returned, he worked at several large engineering firms that sent him around the world for work on projects. When JFK Airport was expanded in the late 1960s, Mr. McKenzie helped determine how much earth needed to be removed to make room for the new terminal and runways. He also helped design launch platforms for NASA's Mercury program in Florida, and worked on repairs to the Suez Canal.

Moving to Falmouth in 1974, he built stage sets for the Falmouth Theatre Guild for such shows as "Li'l Abner" and "The Music Man." He also built furniture at home, often mentoring friends of his youngest son, Matthew, in construction projects, teaching them to shingle a house, for example. This group of friends, dubbed the Skosh Organization, would gather at his Falmouth home to come up with solutions for construction dilemmas.

"He could be reserved at first; but, for instance, he was a clerk at the 1st Precinct [polling place in Falmouth], and people were telling me how funny he was there," his wife, Carol Slaughter McKenzie, said yesterday.

In addition to his wife and son Matthew, of Lee, N.H., Mr. McKenzie leaves three other sons, J. Carl Bohnert of Falmouth, Allen Bohnert of West Roxbury, and Andrew of Brookline Village; a sister, Claire M. Darrow of Georgetown, Maine; and four grandchildren.

A burial service was held Monday at the Massachusetts National Cemetery in Bourne.

Whatzit?

n my column for January-February I asked for help on Great Britain Scott #295 with the overprint S-E-E-B, one letter in each corner. Boy, did I get help! No fewer than six members responded, for which I am most grateful.

The letters stand for South East Electricity Board, now known as Seeboard, an electric power company in London. Kenneth Wills (#2150) noted that in London in the Œ60s his electric bill came with this stamp on it. This would be consistent with others, opinions that these stamps are the equivalent of perfins, to avoid employee pilferage. Other writers, however, thought they were revenue or "receipt" stamps.

A member sent me a large envelope of stamps to



identify. One was this, picturing the collection of rubber sap. The second character at the top is found on all Japanese stamps, and here we have a World War II Japanese occupation stamp. If you look at the "Illustrated Identifier" at back of the Scott Catalogues, you will find in the "Oriental Inscriptions" the various occupied country names illustrated. This one is Malaya N35. As a collector of postally-used stamps only, I have found all Japanese occupation stamps hard to get.

"Plan sur de Valencia" stamps frequently show up in mixtures. Unfortunately they are not listed in Scott. My internet search ultimately revealed they are

stamps postal tax compulsory on all mail from the city of Valencia. The proceeds are used for a huge project to rechannel the Turia River to prevent flooding in the city. The new channel is south (sur) of the city.

Book Review

Wellsted, Rossiter, and Flower: The Stamp Atlas, published by Facts on File, 1986

From the Introduction: "It is almost impossible to assemble a collection of stamps without some knowledge of or interest in the political history of the country or countries by which the stamps were issued."

And I have found no better single reference for general information about stamp-issuing entities than this book. Organized by continent, it shows for each country historical maps, mail routes, first year that stamps were used, first year that stamps were issued, a few stamps in full size and often in color, past and current currencies, and text about general and postal history.

Europe gets more complete historical treatment by organizing the chapter into ten historical periods. And dead countries included: cities, territories, subdivisions, and old names of modern entities.

The maps are the real strength of this book. For example, the complex history of Poland's borders before World War II are illustrated here.

Another map shows the changes in Poland's borders during and after World War II. Other complex situations are clearly mapped: Italian states, areas occupied by Germany during World War II, the Austro-Hungarian Empire, the changing borders Paraguay as it warred with its neighbors, the Napoleanic Empire, the many Pacific island colonies, China treaty ports, and the shifting borders and names in Africa during and after colonization.


Finally, as you are

looking for a specific page, you will encounter miscellaneous postal history related photos and drawings. Scattered throughout are postal historyrelated pictures, such as mail carriers, postal transport methods, post office buildings, and collection boxes. For example, as you are browsing through the Pacific Islands, you will find a photo of the Post box outside the Hotel Metropole in Fiji.

Now for the bad news: the book is out of print, although I had no trouble finding a copy through a used book dealer. Also, the Sandafayre website:

http://www.sandafayre.com/atlas/ has the entire book except for some maps and all the postal history photos and drawings. Even if you own the book, this site gives access to the maps for downloading. You can by this book on CD, updated and corrected, from Sandafayre for about £ 17.

Put Your Duplicates To Work

ave you ever wondered how you can put your duplicate stamps to work for you in order to fill some empty spaces in your collection? If so, the Swap Circuit program, one of the many benefits of being an ISWSC member, is for you!

Here's how the program works. Participants are grouped into a four or five member circuit. The first member of the group is sent a routing sheet (containing the names and addresses of the other members of the circuit and the manager who creates the circuits) and a packet of all different stamps. The first member selects the stamps he/she wants, then replaces them with an equal number of quality all different stamps. The routing sheet and the stamp packet is then mailed to the next member of the circuit.

The process continues until the last member receives the packet and makes his/her swaps. Then the packet is mailed back to the manager of the circuit, along with mint postage for sending out the next circuit. The manager then changes the order of the members, creates a new packet of stamps, and sends it back out to the participants. Once all members of the circuit have been in each position on the circuit (from first to last), a new circuit is formed with a new grouping of participants.

There are currently four circuit types to select

from — Regular, Small, CTO, and Super:

• The Regular circuits consist of 100 stamps that are considered "large" in size — more than 1" x 1 ½" (approximately) in size. Because the Regular circuits are the most popular, participants are broken into two groups based

on their last name: A-I and J-Z.

- Small circuits, containing 100-150 stamps are just the opposite of the Regular circuits those stamps smaller than 1" x 1 ½" in size.
- CTO, or Cancelled To Order, circuits contain 100 stamps and are the only circuit where CTO stamps can be traded.
- The last circuit type, the Super circuit, is the same as the Regular circuits, however each stamp packet contains 200 stamps instead of 100.

Stamps in all circuits must be off paper, but they

may be mint or used, hinged or unhinged.

In order for the program to operate, annual fees are charged to Swap Circuit participants. (The term "fee" is used to distinguish them from the separate dues charged annually to be an ISWSC member. ISWSC membership is required to participate in any ISWSC program.) Except for the programs' annual fees, no cash is needed — for each stamp you select, you simply replace it with another stamp, without regard to the catalog value! In order to maintain the quality of the program, members are, however, encouraged to only swap desirable stamps — common and damaged stamps are not allowed.

If you want to start putting your duplicates to work for you, please join the Swap Circuit program! 
Last, but not least, I have two more scans of a single page from Group 3 and Group 4. These represent a small sample of what is currently in the inventory to peek your interest.
