donating to them for quite some time.

For a while I'd like to talk about "The Exchange Game." Most of us like to exchange stamps. It can be fun and can add to our collections and the collections of those with whom we trade. The letters and notes received from others are the "icing on the cake."

I've placed several exchange ads in Linn's down through the years. The first one was 31 years ago. Those ads have been by Scott value, 100 for 100, and exchange with each keeping only what we need is my favorite way to exchange.)

Three or four years ago I arranged some circuits. Circuits are beneficial if the quality of stamps is maintained by all who participate, but that is not usually the way it works. (Still, resistance is weak! I will arrange more circuits when things "calm down." Too many things are going on for us this summer.)

Twenty-five years ago I found the address of a stamp publication in Great Britain. So I sent an ad copy which I

hoped they would print, asked if they would tell me the cost of printing the ad and if they could take my personal check. I sent a few mint U.S. to make up for the postage they would use to reply. I exchanged with many who answered that ad for several years.

Once exchanging gets "in the blood" it keeps going! I then put an ad in an Australian magazine. I got so many answers to that ad (I think it was 112) that I had to put an ad in Linn's to exchange Australian stamps for U.S. because I didn't have enough U.S to return to the collectors in Australia!

Next came Sweden——then Australia again—then France, and last year Great Britain again.

The ad in France was unbelievable. It did not include the phrase "Stamp exchange with anyone, but correspondence in English only" as in Sweden. answers kept coming and coming.sometimes ll in one mail----from 225 different Before the 225th reply, second people. exchanges were already being sent out. It took lots of purchased U.S. that year. I am still exchanging with many of those collectors. Most of the replies were in French. My two years of French and my two French dictionaries Mere over-worked! But it was fum. Answers to the French ad came from 14 different countries. My replies were sent by surface mail, since most U.S. mail is sent by Air.

I have written to philatelic publications in Greece and Japan, and I think the other two were Germany and Italy, but did not hear from those four.

You might want to try it too. But be very sure you have plenty of U.S. to exchange—excellent, good, bad, damaged and indifferent! That's probably what you'll receive. And make sure that a few evenings are free each week for several weeks to take care of your replies! If my husband hadn't helped me sort the French stamps after the "rush" of exchanges subsided, I wonder if I'd have them in my albums yet!

When it comes to the practical side, probably good pound mixtures from


