The work necessary to obtain a reasonable result will require many months of preparation and participation by a number of talented world-widers, hence we are asking you to read this very carefully, especially the descriptions of the volunteer committee positions, and then respond to Dave Nelson with your suggestions and, if possible, your offer to help. If you DO NOT think we should pursue this, we want to hear that too. (While it is our intention that the program pay for itself with little or no support from the club treasury, the fact is this will be the biggest undertaking the club has ever attempted and the Officers do not wish to have their time so occupied if you, the members, do not think it is the best use of that time.)

Due to the 4 month hiatus between issues, we will not have time to solicit a round of views and then resubmit a plan via the Circuit; the Officers will consider your comments and the existence or absence of a solid corps of volunteers, and will then approve, modify, or cancel. WE WILL NOT PROCEED on the basis of Officer volunteers only...we need YOU, or it's no go.

The International Society of Worldwide Stamp Collectors will sponsor a survey of collectors around the world to determine the stamp they consider to be the most beautiful of all those ever issued. With the moral support or official involvement of major industry leaders, such as the APS Chapters and, perhaps a co-sponsoring periodical such as Linn!s we would organize and carry out a world-wide search for the most attractive single, souvenir sheet and set. Awards would be presented to the winning stamp issuing authority, or a logical surrogate, at the May 1990 Show in London commemorating the 150th anniversary of stamps.

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#### ANNOUNCEMENT: DONATION AUCTION

ISWSC's first annual donation auction is now a reality. Dalene Thomas #101 Of Lakewood, Colorado has volunteered to be our auctioneer, and she will have the rules spelled out for you elsewhere in this issue of "The Circuit." Please send all donation lots to her and do it now, so she can have them organized and listed for the next issue which is in October. With the diversity of membership we have I am sure we can have something for everyone. Give a brief description of what you send and a catalog value and/or suggested sale price. Please make lots worth at least \$5.00 sale value. The names of donors and buyers will not be listed in "The Circuit," and there will not added charge to the buyers. All proceeds above and beyond cost of the sale will go to the treasury. Helping out the treasury in this fashion will keep the annual dues at their present level, and we will also get back our August edition of this publication.

#### Most Beautiful Stamp (Cont'd)

Here are the plans as so far outlined:

COMMITTEE: All MBSH Organizing Committee members will be unpaid volunteers and members of ISWSC. Each member will have a specific area of personal project responsibility which will require timely actions on their part. Out of pocket expenses will be reimbursed. Member Assignments are, at least:

- -Chairman; to serve as the hub of communications among all other members and the liaison between the Committee and ISWSC Officers. Preferably, the Chairman will be able to make a trip to London in 1990 at his/her own expense.
- -Publicity Director; to act as the liaison with our official sponsoring publication and to create and disseminate timely press releases to the world-wide philatelic press and general media.
- -Treasurer; to collect revenues, pay bills and keep accounts for all MASH activities, separately from the ISWSC general fund.
- -Club Correspondent; to communicate with APS American Philatelist columnists that are in charge of Chapters and Affiliates News and to provide information packets to any organizations that may be interested in making nominations.
- --Ballot Selection Manager; -to organize and direct the efforts of a Ballot Selection Committee on which he/she will also serve, to prepare the final ballot for distribution.
- -Issuers Liaison: to communicate with stamp issuing authorities around the world to solicit assistance and participation in various ways, including encouraging them to consider an issue commemorating the contest winners.
- -Endorsements Manager; to seek a limited number of Commercial Sponsors such as a publisher (Scott?), a Dealer (Harris?), a Merchandiser (The Franklin Mint?) that will wish to offer financial or other types of assistance in return for some endorsement or privilege to be extended by the MBSH.
- -Presentations Manager; (This member must be prepared to make a trip to London in May 1990 at his/her own expense) to arrange with the organizers of the Stamp World 1990 show at Alexandra Palace in London a forum for the official presentation of awards to winners, to design and acquire said awards, and to join in the presentation of same.

HOW WINNERS WILL BE CHOSEN:

We will have a minimum of rules, trying not to tell voters what is beautiful. Any stamp, SS, or set issued by any legitimate entity may be nominated. The judges will have the final say about "legitimacy." Nominators of stamps that are not "recognized" by all of the major cataloguers will be required to show some reasonable proof that they were issued for the purpose of carrying mail. Judging will be based SOLELY on face aesthetics. The VALUE of a stamp, on the primary or secondary market, is to be ignored. (i.e. anyone nomi-

nating a U.S. inverted Airmail needs to expect that it will be considered more eye appealing than the intended correct version, and than all other possible single issues of all other nations. (hardly a logical expectation one would think). Historical accuracy, germaneness, technical issues are to be ignored (hence if someone likes the \$1 Trans-Missi-ssippi "Western Cattle in Storm" it is irrelevant that the painting shown was actually done in the Scottish Highlands, etc.)

1. Candidates may be nominated by various in-

terested groups; these nominators will pay a one-time \$5 fee to enter one single, one s/s, and one set; they must accompany their nominations with either a color photograph or actual copies of the stamps and will also be required to provide, on loan, a good copy of any of their entries that make the finals for use in preparing the ballot catalogue. The following groups will be recognized and encouraged to place nominations:

-Any substantive stamp collector organization; all chapters and affiliates of the APS automatically accepted, others may be asked for references.

-Any chapter of ISWSC or any informal group of 2 or more ISWSC members.

-Any stamp collecting journal or periodical that wishes to sponsor a preliminary round among its readers (this provision would be voided if we make an accommodation with one publisher involving exclusive involvement). 
-Any official stamp issuing authority.

-Additionally, each member of the MBSH Organizing committee may make one set of nominations, at his or her discretion, sans entry fee.

3. The final Ballot will be selected by an ISWSC sponsored Ballot Committee to consist of seven members:

-The MBSH Chairman

-The MBSH Ballot Selection Manager -one nominee of the Official Sponsoring philatelic publication

-one nominee of the APS such as an American Philatelist columnist

-one nominee from one of the participating stamp issuing authorities (chosen by lot if multiple volunteers)

-one recognized professional artist, chosen by other B.C. members

-one additional member chosen ad hoc by other B.C. members

4. The final choices will be made by Ballot of all stamp collectors, said ballot to be printed in full color by the sponsorying journal and available ONLY through the pages of that newspaper and by mail direct to all ISWSC Members.

5. There will be only one Overall winner in each of the three categories, but the current intention is to offer recognition in the form of ribbons or certificates for a number of Best-Of-Category entires for such subsets as The 1st (2nd, 3rd) Fifty Years, The best Monochromatic entry, The best Engraved Stamp,

The best Topical Stamp, etc. Suggestions for such awards are actively solicited.

6. Selections, as made by persons voting on the Official sponsoring journal's Ballots will be final, and will be kept secret until the awards ceremony.

Input is being asked of the meskership on the following susctions, and decisions tacks on that input will be made by the Board of Directors.

- 1. A life membership has been requested by several members. Should we establish such a category, and if so, what should the amount be and with what requirements?
- 2. Some members say they do not have 250 duplicates to send as dues. Should we drop that requirement, make an extra cash dues in lieu of, or just ask for stamps for kids on a volunteer basis? Any other suggestions will also be entertained.
